PARKS AND RECREATION REPORT

PROGRAMS

- The NFL Flag season came to an end Wednesday (10/27) Our 6U Champions were the Buccaneers, 8U Champions Packers, 10U Champions Jaguars, 12-14U Champions 49er's.
- We initiated an all-star girls 10U team versus the 10U boys' championship on Friday, October 29th. The boys' team won 13-12. It was a very exciting and close game.
- The AYSO Soccer season ended November 4th. It was a shortened season due to a late start.
- Home school PE continues to meet at the park Tuesday afternoon from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.
- We started registration for our youth basketball program for ages 7 14 through Jr. NBA. We are going to start a 12-week girls basketball program for ages 7 14. The program is sponsored through the WNBA and Women's Sports Foundation. The focus of the program is to inspire the next generation of girls ages 7-14 to play basketball in a positive and healthy way.
- Start Smart / Basketball Clinics registration will begin in December. The clinics will begin in the first week of January.
- We've added an online registration program (Sports Connect) for our sports and camp registrations. This program gives us an opportunity to keep a detailed record the participant and parent information for all the programs they participate in with the City of Marathon Parks and Recreation.

EVENTS

- Trick or Treat Drive Thru was a huge success. We gave out over 200 treat bags. There were 7 other agencies who participated in the event and passed out treats for the kids.
- We also did a virtual Halloween costume contest.

• Ali set-up a craft booth at the Stanley Switlik Elementary School for their Halloween Carnival. She had a great turnout at her booth. We made games and decorations for the carnival. They also used some of our table and chairs for their event.
