OPERATIONS:

- Training:
 - **Fire Officer Training:** All Fire Officers maintain daily Incident Management continuing education as well as accountability training.
 - EMS Training: This month the Firefighters completed 472.93 hours of training. This training included monthly medication exercises. They also participated in NFPA 3000 Training, a PHTLS Class, and a NFPA 1410 Hose Drill. The Drivers Promotional Exam was also conducted.
 - **Fire Training:** All firefighters continue to conduct daily shift drills.
 - **ARFF**: The department has been updating our response criteria and equipment for upcoming airport drills. Six Firefighters traveled for participation in their annual burn.
 - **Tactical Medic Program**: This month 2 fire fighters participated in 12 hours of SWAT training with MSCO.
 - **Combined Training:** Target Solution software for all shifts, a total of 764 courses were taken which totaled 388.54 hours of training.
 - **Instructors on Staff:** We have a total of six instructors with live fire certifications and seven EMS instructors.

BENEVOLENT FIREFIGHTER SERVICES

Benevolent recruitment – The Department continues to support recruitment of additional personnel coordinated through the Marathon Fire Rescue Benevolent Association. The Benevolent was unable to meet this month but we are looking forward to discussing some up and coming event ideas such as a spaghetti dinner, hot dog mac and cheese night, and a garbage rodeo that will include entry fees and prizes at our next meeting. The Benevolent Association continues our commitment to the Fire Department and the community with great pride.

INFORMATION -

The Marathon High School/School Board Fire Recruit Program has started their Fire 1 training. The students have been working with Presents in Paradise assembling bicycles for their program. This will also give them their required community service hours.
