## **OPERATIONS:**

#### • Training:

- o **Fire Officer Training:** All Fire Officers maintain daily Incident Management continuing education as well as accountability training.
- EMS Training: This month the Firefighters completed 368.49 hours of training. This
  training included monthly medication exercises as well as participation in hose testing,
  EVOC, and Infection Control updates.
- o **Fire Training:** All firefighters continue to conduct daily shift drills.
- ARFF: The department has been updating our response criteria and equipment for upcoming airport drills. The firefighters continue to travel to complete their annual burns.
- Tactical Medic Program: This month 2 fire fighters participated in 6 hours of SWAT training with MSCO.
- Combined Training: Target Solution software for all shifts, a total of 752 courses were taken which totaled 368.49 hours of training.
- o **Instructors on Staff:** We have a total of six instructors with live fire certifications and seven EMS instructors.

#### **BENEVOLENT FIREFIGHTER SERVICES**

<u>Benevolent recruitment</u> – The Department continues to support recruitment of additional personnel coordinated through the Marathon Fire Rescue Benevolent Association. The meeting this month entailed a Christmas Pizza Party for all Benevolent members and the on-shift crew. We primarily discussed ways to help a local family who recently lost their son. Some ideas were a TO-GO style spaghetti dinner or a hot dog mac and cheese night with all proceeds benefiting the family. We have 3 students graduating from the Hot Shot Program in January who will test for their EMT immediately and then proceed to their paramedic. We reviewed the 3 open slots for the paramedic students and encourage the Hot Shot Program graduates to fill the positions. For this reason, the Benevolent suggests that the college be willing to coordinate with our candidates free of charge.

#### **INFORMATION** –

The Marathon High School/School Board Fire Recruit Program has started their Fire 1 training. The students finished the first few chapters of the fire standards and have been issued their firefighting gear. They have been working on practical application of what they have learned.
