## **OPERATIONS:**

- **Training:**
  - **Fire Officer Training:** All Fire Officers maintain daily Incident Management continuing education as well as accountability training.
  - **EMS Training:** This month the Firefighters completed 359.46 hours of training. This training included monthly medication exercises and PPE inspections.
  - **Fire Training:** All firefighters continue to conduct daily shift drills they also participated in basic ladder and rope and knots training. The crews also conducted Area Familiarization at the Jolly Roger.
  - **ARFF:** This month the department attended an ARFF meeting, completed an ARFF drill, and passed our ARFF inspection.
  - **Tactical Medic Program:** This month 2 fire fighters participated in 12 hours of SWAT training with MSCO.
  - **Combined Training:** Target Solution software for all shifts, a total of 685 courses were taken which totaled 359.46 hours of training.
  - **Instructors on Staff:** We have a total of six instructors with live fire certifications and seven EMS instructors.

## **BENEVOLENT FIREFIGHTER SERVICES**

***Benevolent recruitment*** – This month the Benevolent contributed funds to support the Wounded Warrior Project, as the Fire Department hosted their luncheon. It was a wonderful and rewarding event. We also discussed a possible Spaghetti Dinner in April, the night before the historic 7 Mile Bridge Run. There is a triannual drill at the Marathon Airport on February 15 from 8AM-11AM which requires a minimum of 20 volunteers if anyone is available to assist, we encourage it. As always, the Department continues to promote recruitment of additional personnel coordinated through the Marathon Fire Rescue Benevolent Association.

## **INFORMATION –**

The Marathon High School/School Board Fire Recruit Program has been able to work on their practical skills along side of our crews. They are in the Fire 1 part of the program which keeps them engaged with more hands-on material.

Although COVID-19 numbers are on the decline, this is no reason to relax your behaviors. Keep up with all you are doing to maintain yourself and your family's safety. As we move into the new year, with many travelers from outside of Florida, now is the time to protect yourself and others. Please follow all recommendations for face masks and wash your hands often.
