OPERATIONS:

• Training:

- Fire Officer Training: All Fire Officers maintain daily Incident Management continuing education as well as this month's "Training Module July 2022"
- EMS Training: This month the Firefighters completed 674.08 hours of training. This
 training includes monthly medication exercises & updated protocols, Area
 Familiarization at Trailer Ranch by the Sea.
- o **Fire Training:** All firefighters continue to conduct daily shift drills, as well as our probationary firefighters task book training.
- ARFF: This month the department conducted the annual ARFF Drill and completed 4-hours of training. Additionally, all crews participated in our monthly training module which included 2 hours of ARFF familiarization along with a special guest, airport manager Mr. Michael Legere.
- o **Tactical Medic Program**: This month 2 fire fighters participated in 16 hours of SWAT Call Out and an additional 4-hour range qualification with MCSO.
- Combined Training: Target Solution software for all shifts, a total of 492 courses were taken which totaled 674.08 hours of training.
- o **Instructors on Staff:** We have a total of six instructors with live fire certifications and seven EMS instructors.
- Other: Event Standby for the 4th of July, The Hoonigan Bridge Stunt, and Keys Brew-B-Que

BENEVOLENT FIREFIGHTER SERVICES

<u>Benevolent recruitment</u> – The Department continues to support recruitment of additional personnel coordinated through the Marathon Fire Rescue Benevolent Association.

INFORMATION –

The department hired 3 new firefighters who are continuing their probationary period and are rotating through the shifts. They have all completed their first rotation and will be formally evaluated before switching to their new shift.

The department is planning on hosting a paramedic school in August at Station 14 which will offer our EMTs the convenience and opportunity to gain their paramedic license to aid in their career and with the department.

We currently have three former cadets in the Hotshots program. Two have been hired part time with the city. A total of three cadets are State Certified firefighters, by the end of the current Hotshots program we will have six firefighters in 3 years of holding this class.

As always, remain prepared for storm season. Ensure your emergency evacuation plans are in place and stay safe.
