PARKS AND RECREATION REPORT

PROGRAMS

- Youth Soccer season ends October 12th. Games were pushed back a week due to hurricane lan passing to the west of us.

BEACHES

Sombrero Beach

- Sombrero Beach had some damage from Hurricane Ian.(see attached pics)
 - Volleyball nets were removed because the storm
 - Shade structure was removed for the storm and will be put back up after hurricane season is over.
 - Westside area that was being used for kayak launch lost a lot of sand and rocks were exposed.
- The playground structure took a beaten from the storm. A lot of sand and salt was all over the playground structure and pour-in-play surface.

Coco Plum

- Coco Plum was flooded with seaweed from Hurricane Ian (see attached)
- The beach had to be closed for a week to clean up the seaweed and debris from the parking lot and beach area

PARKS

Jesse Hobbs

• The shade structure for Jessie Hobbs was removed for the storm. The shade structure will be put back up once hurricane season is over.

Community Park

- There was no real damage to park from the storm.
- There are a couple tiles on the fitness court that are starting to "bubble up". I contacted the installer, and he gave sent me the adhesive needed to fix the problem. If that does not work, they will be coming back to fix the problem.
- The shade structure was not removed for the storm after speaking with the vendor and getting confirmation that the shade can withstand a storm of 75 mile an hour sustained winds.
 - The playground equipment held up very well through the storm.

Rotary Park / Dog Park

- There was minimal damage to Rotary Park from the storm except for fallen tree limbs. Brightview did a great job cleaning up the dog park before reopening it to the public.
- There have been no recent complaints about the slides being to hot. Signs have been placed around the playground area warning visitors the play surface may be hot.
- We had placed orders for tables about a month ago. The shipping was delayed for the tables, so we are waiting for a confirmation of when the tables will be shipped out. In the meantime, we are taking reservations for anyone who would like to reserve a pavilion at Rotary, and we are letting them know to bring their own chairs if they like.

Ocean front / Events Field

• There was some flooding that occurred from the storm. There was seaweed and debris throughout the walkways and south end of the park. No other substantial damage was done.
