OPERATIONS:

• Training:

- **Fire Officer Training:** All Fire Officers maintained daily incident management, continuing education as well as this month's "Training Module December 2022"
- **EMS Training:** This month the Firefighters completed 48 hours of training. This training includes monthly medication exercises, updated protocols, and EMS equipment refresher. Area Familiarization was completed at Indigo Reef Resort. Additionally, three (3) personnel completed 150.5 hours of Critical Care Training from a University of Florida grant funded program. They are now in the TOP 1% of the nation as UF CCP Graduates.
- **Fire Training:** All firefighters continue to conduct daily shift drills; they also completed NFPA 1410 hose drills. Additionally, Lt. Meneses set up an extrication demonstration for Leadership Monroe.
- **ARFF:** This month four (4) members completed their annual 5-hour FAA compliance training burn at the Fire Academy of South. This training is funded by the FAA. This makes nine (9) members ARFF compliant.
- **Tactical Medic Program:** This month two (2) firefighters participated in 8-hours of SWAT Call Out with MCSO. Additionally, Lt. Moreton set up a SWAT demonstration for Leadership Monroe at Joe London Training Facility.
- **Combined Training:** Vector Solution software for all shifts, a total of 328 courses were taken which totaled 183.29 hours of training.
- **Instructors on Staff:** We have a total of seven instructors with live fire training certifications and seven EMS instructors.
