OPERATIONS:

• Training:

• **Fire Officer Training:** All Fire Officers maintained daily incident management, continuing education as well as working on preparations for the upcoming storm season.

• **EMS Training:** This month the Firefighters completed 48 hours of training. This training includes monthly medication exercises, updated protocols, and an EMS equipment refresher.

• **Fire Training:** All firefighters continue to conduct daily shift drills; they also completed NFPA 1410 hose drills.

• **Tactical Medic Program**: This month one (1) firefighter participated in 4-hours of SWAT Call Out with MCSO.

• **Combined Training:** Vector Solution software for all shifts, a total of 386 courses were taken, which totaled 15.38 hours of training.

• Instructors on Staff: We have a total of six instructors with live fire training certifications and seven EMS instructors.

BENEVOLENT FIREFIGHTER SERVICES

The Benevolent Association was short of a few participants so full attendance for the meeting was not met. The Benevolent discussed having a bagel breakfast available at Station 14 the morning of the 7-mile Bridge Run (April 1st) to serve our participants with a good hearty breakfast prior to the event. There will be a meeting on the third Thursday in April, providing we have available personnel. As always, we continue to support recruitment of additional personnel coordinated through the Marathon Fire Rescue Benevolent Association.

INFORMATION

The pursuit for a new Fire Chief has been narrowed down to four candidates. The candidates traveled to Marathon for a face-to-face interview which included meeting with the City Manager, HR director, Union Representative and me for additional questions and clarification of the position requirements. We ended with an informal light lunch at Station 14 to show off the department and equipment. This encounter gave the candidates a chance to have a more casual question and answer with some of the officers and staff. We will meet next week to discuss the outcome of the process moving forward.

There will be many challenges in the upcoming year as the city is growing in leaps and bounds. Several large developments are beginning as well as many nearing completions. This will bring challenges to our city and emergency services. The department is dedicated to ensuring we are ready to serve the community with the highest possible commitment to the city.

The department's high school cadet program hopes to continue providing the city by training highly educated students and future motivated employees to serve our community.

Currently we have three open positions for Firefighter Paramedic/EMT. We hosted an entrance exam last week that rendered no successful participants. The department has reopened advertisement for the positions and expects to retest again in May.
