#### **OPERATIONS:**

## • Training:

- o **Fire Officer Training:** All Fire Officers maintained daily incident management, continuing education as well as working on preparations for the upcoming storm season.
- o **EMS Training:** This month the Firefighters completed 72 hours of training. This training includes monthly medication exercises, updated protocols, and an EMS equipment refresher.
- Fire Training: All firefighters continue to conduct daily shift drills; they also completed NFPA 1410 hose drills.
- Tactical Medic Program: This month one (1) firefighter participated in 16-hours of SWAT Call Out with MCSO.
- Combined Training: Vector Solution software for all shifts, a total of 149 courses were taken, which totaled 69.3 hours of training.
- o **Instructors on Staff:** We have a total of six instructors with live fire training certifications and seven EMS instructors.

### **BENEVOLENT FIREFIGHTER SERVICES**

The Benevolent Association had another successful meeting this month. We discussed the induction of a new member and are following up with City requirements. Discussion of this year's Christmas party and coordinating a few dates for "Firefighter Bingo" were also on the agenda. As always, we continue to support recruitment of additional personnel coordinated through the Marathon Fire Rescue Benevolent Association.

### **INFORMATION**

The department has completed the new hire training and personnel are assigned to shift. We are at full staffing for emergency response. The inter-facility transport team has 2 openings for paramedics that will need to be filled. The department continues to attempt to recruit qualified personnel.

The high school cadet program has begun and has 10 students enrolled. Their first challenge will be Emergency Medical Training, this is a state certification which will help them continue their careers as EMTS or Paramedics.

We were lucky that Idalia passed us to the west, sparing our island. The department advises you to make sure you have your storm plans and property secure in case we do need to evacuate. We still have the height of the season ahead of us. Please be prepared.
