OPERATIONS:

• Training:

- Fire Officer Training: All Fire Officers maintain daily Incident Management continuing education as well as this month's "Training Module November 2022"
- EMS Training: This month the Firefighters completed 229.92 hours of training. This
 training includes monthly medication exercises & updated protocols, Area
 Familiarization at Banana Bay Resort.
- Fire Training: All firefighters continue to conduct daily shift drills; they also completed NFPA 1410 hose drills.
- ARFF: This month (5) members completed their annual 5-hour FAA compliance training burn at the Fire Academy of South. (3) more will attend this month.
- Tactical Medic Program: This month 2 fire fighters participated in 16 hours of SWAT Call Out with MCSO.
- Combined Training: Target Solution software for all shifts, a total of 234 courses were taken which totaled 229.92 hours of training.
- o **Instructors on Staff:** We have a total of seven instructors with live fire certifications and seven EMS instructors.

BENEVOLENT FIREFIGHTER SERVICES
