Monthly Report: May 2024

Dear Council:

Deputies increased their traffic stops by 40% from 812 in March to 857 in April. Physical arrests increased from 51 to 57, while DUI investigations decreased from 11 to 7. A total of 39 Notices to Appear were issued in March.

Marine Deputy Willie Guerra has reached the final stages of his derelict vessel investigations. He is working with FWC in preparation for the removal process of the vessels.

An estimated 850 watch cards were distributed as a result of neighborhood patrols, watch order and extra patrols.

Criminal Investigations Unit cases resulted in arrests or warrants. Crimes resulting in contractor frauds were most investigated in the month of April.

Overall, Deputies in District 4 continue to work hard.

Crime/Arrest Report:

MCSO24OFF0002367- Vessel Burglary

Victim, charter boat captain, stated that someone stole multiple of his rods overnight. All of the neighbors stated that they did not hear or see anything throughout the night. Due to weather no physical evidence could be collected. Currently awaiting security camera footage.

MCSO24OFF002007- Threats

Suspect, Bruce Gee threaten to harm and batter victim, Teresa Konrath, who is a teacher at MHS during dismissal. Suspect was located and taken into custody and Threat Management case was activated. Victim was assisted by detectives in getting an injunction against suspect at her request.

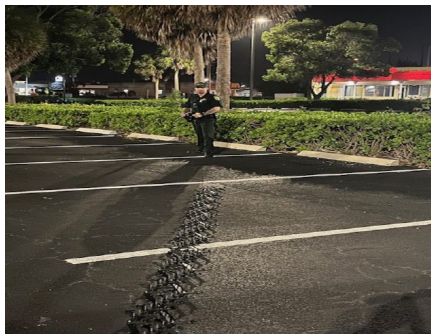
