Safer Streets For All (SS4A) Safety Action Plan Presentation – Chris Benitez with Stantec presented a PowerPoint Presentation regarding the purpose of the study, which was one hundred percent grant funded by FDOT, the outreach comments, intersection improvements being advanced, policy survey results and recommendations and the remaining project schedule. Benitez explained that once the action plan is adopted, it can be used to pursue additional federal grant funding for design, construction, and education initiatives. Benitez reviewed the recommendations at specific locations as well as policy recommendations and their ranking. Struyf questioned how many people completed the survey and Stantec representatives informed everyone 22 people completed the survey. Struyf commented that e-bikes were an issue as well as lighting, flooding, and sidewalks. Matlock explained that his issues were landscaping in the easements and e-bikes as well as golf carts, especially when ten- and eleven-year-olds were driving them. Matlock commented he was not a fan of a blockade on bike paths. Captain Paul informed everyone the sheriff's office was waiting to see the legislation for e-bikes to see the specific language. Covelli informed everyone that an FDOT grant would help address flooding on Sombrero and lighting at Aviation by 2027. The Council also discussed 107th Street road and bike path that needed to be cleaned up. Matlock commented that we need to make sure hedges are cut to avoid blind spots. Shea asked that the Council rank the spreadsheet priorities and get it back to him by Friday.
