RE: Monroe County Sheriff's Office Monthly Report May 2026

Dear Council,

Enclosed is the District 4/5 May 2026 Monthly Report. District activity increased from April, with patrol responding to a higher volume of calls for service while maintaining proactive enforcement efforts throughout the district. Despite staffing challenges, leave usage, and training commitments, all squads continued to meet operational expectations and provide consistent service to the community.

During May, District 4/5 deputies handled more than 3,600 calls for service, including over 2,600 self-initiated activities (SIFA) and nearly 800 backup responses. Deputies conducted over 600 traffic stops and issued more than 280 Traffic Citations, demonstrating continued emphasis on traffic enforcement and high-visibility patrol operations. Marine Unit personnel remained active throughout the district, conducting 34 marine resource checks and issuing 4 resource citations, consistent with seasonal boating and fishing activity.

Proactive enforcement and intelligence gathering remained strong during the month. Deputies completed nearly 100 Field Intelligence Reports, generated approximately 150 incident and crash reports, and authored 28 charge reports. A total of 9 DUI arrests were made during the reporting period, reflecting continued targeted enforcement efforts across multiple shifts.

The Criminal Investigations Unit (CIU) managed a demanding investigative workload involving financial crimes, cryptocurrency fraud, threat management investigations, elder exploitation cases, and organized theft schemes. During May, the unit carried over 56 active investigations from the previous month and was assigned an additional 13 new cases, while maintaining 5 active Threat Management cases. Detectives continued to work complex investigations involving cryptocurrency scams, financial exploitation, organized fraud schemes, and cyber-enabled crimes requiring extensive subpoena preparation, search warrants, financial analysis, and coordination with outside agencies.

Major investigations included a \$225,000 ACH diversion fraud, a multi-state cryptocurrency fraud operation linked to organized criminal activity, a law enforcement



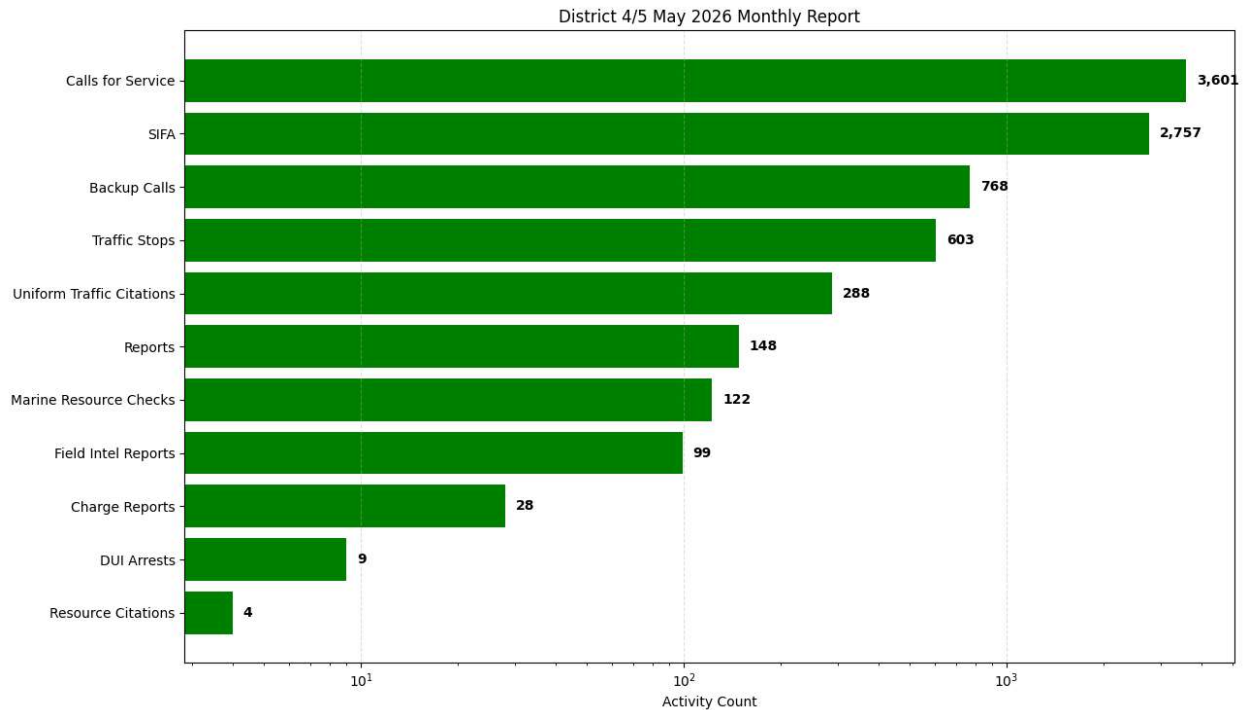
impersonation scam resulting in more than \$31,500 in losses, and an elder exploitation investigation involving forged checks totaling more than \$10,000. The unit also continued active monitoring and investigation of Threat Management cases involving threats toward law enforcement personnel and members of the community.

Crime/Arrest Report:

MCSO26OFF002982: Domestic Battery (11th street)- Victim reported that his ex-girlfriend Skylar Daniels threw a hat and remote, striking his shoulder. Sworn statement completed, charges requested. Skylar was located, arrested by D/S Mumper, medically cleared at Fishermen's, and transported to Key West Jail.

MCSO26OFF002990: Kevin MacKinnon was arrested for DUI and DUI refusal. Dep. DelCueto.

MCSO26OFF003010: Brian Hills was arrested on a warrant for violation of conditions for a DUI. Dep. Metzger

MCSO26OFF003132: DUI-91st street- Christopher A. Sincic- Traffic stop led to a DUI investigation. Probable cause was developed and driver was placed into custody, BAC .232. Dep. Quick

MCSO26OFF003292: Domestic (103 41st)- Christopher Dorsey arrested for battery and child neglect after pushing his ex-girlfriend multiple times during a domestic dispute while she was leaving with their children, causing her to fall onto their two-year-old daughter.

MCSO26OFF003351: DUI-Linda Z. Gonzalez-RaceTrac–Linda called in for an alleged domestic at the Brass Monkey prior to her leaving. RP gave out car description then was pulled over. Linda did SFST's and later arrested. Breath test result of 0.265. Dep. Marino.

MCSO26OFF003396: Nateeshkka Troche was arrested for being a Habitual Traffic Offender and resisting without violence. Dep. Casanova.

MCSO26OFF003513: Unknown Problem – Race Trac - RP Cory Dennis repeatedly called 911 making profane statements toward MCSO before hanging up. Upon deputies locating Cory and attempting to detain him, he physically resisted by striking Deputies, pushing Sergeant O'Neill while fleeing on foot, and kicking Deputy Rivera-Corona before ultimately being secured and hobbled due to continued resistance. Cory later continued making threats to kill law enforcement personnel following his release from jail.

MCSO26OFF003539: Traffic stop–Geneva E. Jim- Odor or marijuana led to PC search. Aprox. 30 grams of FTP marijuana located in car. Geneva arrested for marijuana possession (>20), paraphernalia, and convicted felon in possession of ammunition. Dep. Marino
