City enforces temporary sign laws

MARATHON, FL (July 21, 2026) – It's a sign of the times: The proliferation of political placards throughout the community.

The City of Marathon has strict temporary sign regulations for political signage, and those in violation are removed by Code Enforcement. The signs can be retrieved by candidates or their representatives at Marathon City Hall, 9805 Overseas Highway.

According to the city's Municipal Code, no temporary sign may be placed in the public right-of-way, which is the area between a roadway and the boundary of private property. Candidates must have an owner's express permission to place signs on private property.

Additionally, residential properties are allowed up to four signs but cannot exceed a total of 6 square feet. Non-residential properties are allowed up to three signs but cannot exceed a total of 12 square feet. Parcels zoned commercial or mixed use are limited to three signs.

Temporary campaign signs can only be displayed for a maximum of 60 days a year.
