ORDINANCE NO. 01-09-10

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MARATHON, FLORIDA, APPROVING AND ADOPTING THE BUDGET OF THE CITY OF MARATHON FOR FISCAL YEAR 2001/2002; PROVIDING FOR A BUDGET BASIS; PROVIDING FOR EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS: PROVIDING FOR CARRYOVER OF FUNDS: **PROVIDING FOR PROVIDING NOTICE: FOR** SEVERABILITY; **PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT**; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Marathon is a municipality located in Monroe County, Florida; and

WHEREAS, public hearings on the City of Marathon's final budget for fiscal year 2001/2002 were held at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, September 4, 2001 and Tuesday, September 18, 2001, at the Marathon Government Center, 2798 Overseas Highway, Marathon, Florida; and

WHEREAS, the amount available from taxation equals the total appropriations for expenditures and reserves;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARATHON, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: Budget Adoption.

The City of Marathon's final budget for the Fiscal Year 2001/2002, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A", is hereby approved and adopted and shall become effective at the beginning of the 2001/2002 Fiscal Year, and the City's funds may be expended commencing October 1, 2001 and ending September 30, 2002.

Section 2: Budget Basis.

The proposed expenditures in the final budget are as shown in the budget and by reference made a part hereof. The budget is based upon the taxable value of real and personal property of \$1,081,545,480.00.

Section 3: Expenditure of Funds.

The City Manager or his designee is authorized to expend or contract for expenditures such necessary funds for operation of the city government in accordance with the budget adopted hereby.

Section 4: Carryover of Funds.

Funds of the City's 2000/2001 final budget not expended during the current 2000/2001 fiscal year may be used and expended during subsequent fiscal years.

Section 5: Notice.

The City Clerk is directed to forward certified copies of this Ordinance to the Monroe County Property Appraiser; the Monroe County Revenue Collector, and the Florida Department of Revenue.

Section 6: Severability.

If any one or more of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be held contrary to any express of law or contrary to the policy of express law, though not expressly prohibited or against public policy, or shall for any reason whatsoever be held invalid; then such provision shall be null and void and shall be separate from the remaining provisions, and shall in no way affect the validity of all other provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 7: Conflict.

That all Sections or parts of the Code of Ordinances, all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances, and all Resolutions, in conflict are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 8: Effective Date.

This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption on second reading.
