## CITY OF MARATHON, FLORIDA ORDINANCE 2009-27

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MARATHON, FLORIDA AMENDING THE CITY'S COMPREHENSIVE PLAN TABLE 6-1 "CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM" AS REQUIRED ANNUALLY; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF CONFLICTING PROVISIONS; PROVIDING FOR TRANSMITTAL OF THIS ORDINANCE TO THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY AFFAIRS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE UPON THE APPROVAL OF THIS ORDINANCE BY THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY AFFAIRS

WHERAS, the City of Marathon (the "City") has adopted a Comprehensive Plan which has been found to be in compliance by the State Department of Community Affairs ("DCA"), pursuant to Chapter 163, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the City is located within the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern (the "FKACSC"), as established pursuant to Chapter 380, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, Section 380.552, Florida Statutes, establishes Principal for Guiding Development in the FKACSC; and

WHEREAS, the City finds it appropriate to amend Table 6-1 ("Comprehensive Plan Amendments") in order to further protect the health, safety, and welfare of the City of Marathon; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 163.3 174, Florida Statutes, and Section 9.5-22 of the Code, the City's Planning Commission sitting as the Local Planning Agency has publicly considered the amendments to the Code set forth in this Ordinance (the "Amendments") at a properly noticed public hearing and recommended to the City Council the adoption of the Amendments; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Sections 163.3184 and 166.041, Florida Statutes, public notice has been given of the public hearings for the adoption of this Ordinance amending the Code; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds the adoption of this Ordinance is in the best interest of the City and complies with applicable State laws and rules: and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that enactment of this Ordinance furthers the objectives, goals, and policies of the City's Comprehensive Plan and the Principles for Guiding Development of the FKACSC.

# NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARATHON, FLORIDA THAT:

**Section 1.** Table 6-1 of the Comprehensive Plan of the City of Marathon, Florida is hereby amended to read as attached as Exhibit A hereto.

**Section 2.** All conflicting Ordinances and Regulations after the adoption of this Ordinance are hereby repealed; and

Section 3. The provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable and if any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance shall for any reason be declared to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this Ordinance but they shall remain in effect, it being the legislative intent that this Ordinance shall stand notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.

**Section 4.** The provisions of this Ordinance constitute a "Land Development Regulation" as defined by State law. Accordingly, the City Clerk is authorized to forward a copy of this Ordinance to the DCA for approval pursuant to Sections 380.05(6) and (11), Florida Statutes.

**Section 5.** This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon approval by the State Department of Community Affairs pursuant to Chapter 380, Florida Statutes.
