

RESOLUTION NO. 00-09-42

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARATHON, FLORIDA, PROVIDING FOR COORDINATION WITH THE U.S. FISH & WILDLIFE SERVICE CONCERNING THE REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENT PERMITS FOR PARCELS WITHIN THE CITY OF MARATHON TARGETED AS HAVING POSSIBLE ENDANGERED SPECIES, FLORA, OR FAUNA AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City desires to participate in the National Flood Insurance Program (“NFIP”) and

WHEREAS, as a condition the City’s participation in the NFIP the City must coordinate with the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service concerning the review of development permits in order to identify those parcels that have been targeted by the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service as having possible endangered species, flora or fauna.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARATHON, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:


Section 1. Recitals. The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 2. The City shall review permit applications to screen for those parcels that have been targeted by the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service as having possible endangered species, flora or fauna (the “Targeted Parcels”).

Section 3. The City shall refer permit applicants for the Targeted Parcels to the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.


