RESOLUTION NO. 00-09-50

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF MARATHON, FLORIDA; ADOPTING THE FINAL MILLAGE RATE OF THE CITY FOR THE FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING OCTOBER 1, 2000, THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2001, PURSUANT TO SECTION 200.065, FLORIDA STATUTES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 200.065, Florida Statutes, Ervin A. Higgs, Property Appraiser of Monroe County, Florida, has made tax assessments for all real property within the City of Marathon, Florida (the "City"); and

WHEREAS, on July 25, 2000, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 00-07-32 determining the "Proposed Millage Rate" for the fiscal year commencing October 1, 2000, and further scheduled the final public hearing required by Section 200.065, Florida Statutes to be held on September 26, 2000, at 7:00 p.m.; and

WHEREAS, the first public hearing, as required by Section 200.065(2)(d), was held by the City Council on September 13, 2000, commencing at 7:00 p.m., as previously noticed and the public and all interested parties having had the opportunity to address their comments to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, having considered the comments of the public regarding the final millage rate and having complied with the "TRIM" requirements of the Florida Statutes, adopts the following millage rate.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARATHON, FLORIDA AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** Recitals. The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference.
- Section 2. That the final millage rate for the City for the fiscal year commencing October 1, 2000 through September 30, 2001 is fixed at the rate of 2.9645 mills, which is \$2.96 per \$1,000.00 of assessed property within the City of Marathon, Florida.
- **Section3. Effective Date.** This resolution shall be effective immediately upon its adoption.
