A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARATHON, FLORIDA, SETTING THE PROPOSED MILLAGE RATE PURSUANT TO SECTION 200.065(2)(b), FLORIDA STATUTES, AND SETTING THE DATE, TIME AND PLACE AT WHICH A PUBLIC HEARING WILL BE HELD TO CONSIDER THE CITY OF MARATHON'S PROPOSED MILLAGE RATE AND TENTATIVE **BUDGET;** AND DIRECTING CERTIFIED COPY THIS THAT Α OF **RESOLUTION BE SENT TO THE MONROE COUNTY** PROPERTY APPRAISER AND TAX COLLECTOR: AND **PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

WHEREAS, Section 200.065, Florida Statutes, commonly known as the "Truth in Millage Bill" or the "TRIM" Bill provides that a taxing authority shall advise the Property Appraiser and Tax Collector of its proposed millage rate, its current year rolled-back rate, and of the date, time and place at which a public hearing will be held to consider the property millage rate and tentative budget; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 200.065(2)(b), Florida Statutes, the taxing authority must advise the Property Appraiser of said proposed millage rate and the date, time and place at which a public hearing will be held to consider the proposed millage rate and tentative budget for the preparation of the Notice of Proposed Property Taxes (TRIM Notice).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARATHON, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: The proposed property tax millage rate of the City of Marathon for Fiscal Year 2001/2002 shall not exceed **2.9645** mills.

Section 2: The "rolled-back" millage rate for Fiscal Year 2001/2002, calculated pursuant to Section 200.065(1), Florida Statutes, is 2.7054 mills.
